POST-SECONDARY

1. University of Saskatchewan

- University <u>summer classes</u> give high school students a head start on their degree program
 and lighten their load for the upcoming school year. The <u>deadline</u> to apply is <u>May 1st</u>. Be
 sure to check with a U of S counsellor to ensure that the course you choose meets your
 program's requirements.
- Students enrolled in the Arts & Science, St. Thomas More, Agriculture & Bioresources,
 Engineering and Kinesiology programs can sign up for <u>Learning Communities</u>. It's a great
 way for first year students to develop a sense of belonging and build leadership skills. LC
 students register in a common set of 2 or 3 classes and receive weekly assistance from peers
 and university mentors.
- If you are planning to attend the University of Saskatchewan, you'll want to download the iUsask app. It will provide you lots of useful information like admissions details, upcoming events, maps, directories, announcements, etc.

2. University of Regina

- Even though the priority deadline has passed, most applications will remain open until August 15th. Applications can be found online.
- Students interested in applying to the Faculty of Engineering should apply earlier rather
 than later. Due to high demand, limited capacity and a desire to ensure quality programming
 for a positive student experience the Admissions team and the Dean of Engineering will be
 closely monitoring Engineering enrolments week to week in case it becomes necessary to
 begin considering waitlist options. Any student who has already applied and been accepted
 will not be affected!
- March 1st was the **Faculty of Education** application deadline however the deadline has been extended until all the programs reach capacity. Go to the **online application**.

- **UR Beginning!**, a new event for grade 12 students who have been admitted to the University of Regina and their Federated Colleges, will be held on May 8th. There will be academic advising session (lead by their Faculties and/or College) to help students register in their first semester classes. While on-campus students will have the opportunity to take campus, faculty, and residence tours; meet professors, staff and current students; spend a night in the U of R or Luther residences; register for parking; obtain their Student ID Cards; and much more! - The **University of Regina** offers the only **Bachelor of Fine Arts in Film Production** between Toronto and Vancouver; students get hands on experience in a wide range of filmmaking practices and a thorough grounding in film/media history and theory. 3. Saskatchewan Polytechnic

- Students enrolled in a Polytechnic program beginning in the fall can apply for scholarships starting **June 1**st. The application **deadline** for these scholarships is **July 15**th.
- The new <u>Recreation and Community Development</u> program at the Saskatoon campus empowers students to become recreation directors, managers of sport/ recreation/culture, community development officers, facility managers and special events managers. There are still seats available for this program.

4. Great Plains College

- Seats are still available in the following full-time post-secondary programs:
 - Administrative Assistant (Kindersley, Swift Current & Warman Campus)
 - Business (Swift Current)
 - > Electrician (Biggar & Swift Current)
 - > 4th Class Power Engineering (Kindersley)

Students who apply before **April 30th** are automatically considered for the \$500 – \$5,000 grade-based entrance scholarships!

- The **Educational Assistant** program offered at the Warman Campus has been suspended for the 2015-16 academic year due to low enrolments. Students who applied to this program will be contacted by a student adviser to discuss their options.
- Open House will be held at the Biggar Campus on April 15th, 6-8 p.m. Learn about Adult Basic Education, Certificate in Health, Safety & Environmental Processes, Continuing Care Assistant, Electrician, Practical Nursing and Skills & Safety Training programs.
- The full-time <u>Business</u> certificate program is now being offered at the Warman Campus. Applications are currently being accepted for September entry. Individuals who apply as full-time students before <u>April 30th</u> will be eligible for a \$500-5,000 Entrance Scholarship. The Business certificate provides foundational learning for careers in accounting, administration, financial services, human resources, insurance and marketing. Graduates are prepared to enter the workforce, transfer directly into a diploma program at Saskatchewan Polytechnic or transfer credits to a University degree program.

5. North West Regional College

- The North West Regional College offers quality post-secondary education options at both campuses in North Battleford and Meadow Lake. The trades offer a unique experience to learn in the classroom and in the workforce gaining you valuable hands-on training. The trades are high in demand jobs and offer you numerous job opportunities.
- Hairstylist is a one-year certificate pre-employment program that runs from July 27th, 2015 to June 24th, 2016 at the Battlefords Campus. The Hairstylist program offers you the fabulous opportunity to learn how to style hair, wigs and hairpieces as well as techniques for skin and nails. You will also provide salon services under the supervision of two journeyperson hairstylists gaining you valuable experience in the industry. For more information, please click here.
- Heavy Equipment & Truck & Transport Technician is a one year certificate program that
 runs from September 8th, 2015 to June 30th, 2016 at the Meadow Lake Campus. The Heavy
 Equipment & Truck & Transport Technician program provides knowledge and skill servicing,
 maintaining, testing, diagnosing and repairing heavy diesel engine vehicles such as the heavy
 equipment, trucks, buses and transport vehicles. You get two weeks work placement in the

6. Saskatchewan Regional Colleges

These colleges offer a selection of university classes, Saskatchewan Polytechnic certificate and diploma programs, and some programs from institutions outside Saskatchewan like Lakeland College and Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT). Programs offered including Power Engineering Technician, Electrician, Practical Nursing, Continuing Care Assistant, Office Education and Hairstylist. SCHOLARSHIPS

- The <u>SaskTel Aboriginal Youth Awards of Excellence</u> recognize youth achievement. Nominees must be of Aboriginal ancestry, 14-18 years old and have demonstrated outstanding commitment and/or ability in one of the 10 award categories. Application <u>deadline</u> is <u>April 16th</u>.
- 2. If you will be a first year full-time student this fall in a Saskatchewan-based, post-secondary program associated with the agrology industry (e.g. agriculture, bioresources, environmental science, etc.) then plan to apply for a \$1,000 Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists Branch Scholarship. The deadline to apply is April 30th, 2015.
- 3. District 32 Agriculture, Development and Diversification Board (ADD Board) is offering a total of three \$500 awards to Grade 12 students graduating in 2015. Students must be pursuing post-secondary agricultural training (university or technical). Students are asked to prepare and provide a submission that addresses the following: "Identify one of the challenging issues that face farmers in Saskatchewan today and how the issue may be resolved." Submission should be a minimum of 250 words and maximum of 500 words. Covering letter to include: Applicant's name, address, phone number, email address; High school information name, location, phone number; Post-secondary information name of institution and program of study. Applications are to be emailed to barry.swanson@sasktel.net. Deadline is April 30th, 2015.

- **4.** The **Wolfe Family General Achievement Entrance Scholarship** has recently been established for entering Campion students. The value is **\$6,500** with the possibility of renewal for up to 3 years (a potential value of **\$26,000**). The criteria is as follows:
 - Students must be a Saskatchewan resident and graduate from a Saskatchewan high school
 - ➤ Must have an admission average of 90% or higher
 - Demonstrate compassion through active service within the community, and show a commitment to athletics through involvement in sports

- **5.** As part of Luther's commitment to student success, Luther College offers **\$55,000** in awards to Luther students each year. The **deadline** to apply is **May 15th, 2015**. Visit their **website** to view the list of available Entrance Awards.
- **6.** Students who apply to a full-time student loan-eligible program at **Great Plains College** before **April 30th, 2015** are automatically considered for a **\$500** Entrance Scholarship. Students who enter the Administrative Assistant, Bachelor of Social Work, Business, Electrician, University, Welding and Youth Care Worker programs may be awarded up to **\$5,000**.
- **7.** The <u>CRI Canada Learning Grant Program</u> will award two grants in the amounts of **\$1000** to eligible students for full-time study at a qualifying Canadian college or university in 2015.
 - > Must be a member of a Saskatchewan Credit Union
 - > Transcript and a letter of reference are required.
 - ➤ Need to submit an essay of 500 words or less or a 3-5 min. video describing achievements.

The application **deadline** is **April 30th**, **2015**.

- **8.** The <u>Prince of Wales Scholarship</u> is intended to assist Grade 11 students in Community Schools complete post-secondary education. Nomination criteria includes school and community based leadership, financial need and academic performance. The **deadline** for applications is **April 30th**, **2015**.
- 9. SaskTel Métis Scholarships are for self-declared Métis students studying in a field directly related to telecommunications. Programs include Engineering, Business/Commerce and Computer Science. Students must demonstrate financial need and submit a statement about leadership skills and community involvement. Applications will be accepted until May 1st, 2015.
- 10. Grade 11 and 12 students: If you or your parents are members of the Affinity Credit Union, there is money available for post-secondary training anywhere in Saskatchewan. The <u>Build a Better World Scholarship Program</u> will give out 88 scholarships in 2015. The <u>deadline</u> for application is <u>May 3rd</u>, 2015.
- **11.** If you are in Grade 11, on track to graduate next year and planning your post-secondary education, apply for an <u>Elwood Harvey Co-operative Leadership Award</u>. Twenty-six scholarships of **\$2,500** each are available through this award program designed to help those youth who aspire to make a difference. The application **deadline** is **May 3rd, 2015**.
- **12.** <u>Saskatchewan Pulse Growers</u> offers five \$5000 scholarships to first-year students enrolled in the fall in a Saskatchewan-based post-secondary agriculture program. To be eligible for one of these scholarships the student or the student's parent(s) must be an active pulse producer in Saskatchewan. The **deadline** for applications is **May 8th**, **2015**.
- **13.** <u>The Premier's Centennial Arts Scholarship</u> provides financial assistance to Saskatchewan undergraduate students in their development as professional artists. At least one scholarship will

be provided to an applicant studying arts administration or cultural leadership. Studies may be full or part-time in any fine arts discipline and must be undertaken at an accredited post-secondary institution or in a recognized fine arts training program. Applications must be received by **May 15th, 2015**.

- **14.** The <u>Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship</u> provides all Grade 12 students who graduate in Saskatchewan with up to **\$500** per year to a lifetime maximum of **\$2,000** when attending a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution or are confirmed to be in a Saskatchewan designated seat in an educational institution identified through interprovincial agreements. Graduates will have up to 10 years to use the Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship.
- 15. The National Union of Public and General Employees is offering 4 scholarships (\$1,500 each) to students who plan to enter the first year of a public post-secondary educational institution full-time in 2015-2016 and who are children, grandchildren, or foster children/grandchildren, of a National Union member. In Saskatchewan that would be the SGEU. The deadline to apply for these scholarships is July 6th, 2015. For application forms and a description of each scholarship, click here.

- **4.** A reminder to Grade 10, 11 and 12 students: The **Summer Youth Internship Program** is now accepting applications. Students who are placed in the program obtain summer employment and get paid competitive industry wages, as well as have the opportunity to complete their youth apprenticeship over the summer.
