A group of 6 amazing Sun West Leadership Students helped plan this life/career investigation event for their peers. Unique this year was a "Open Doors To Opportunity" SKYPE session with a consultant from England (formerly from SK) who talk to students about amazing jobs available in the world that don't often get introduced to young people. 

Post-Secondary Information

Great Plains College: The deadline for the <u>Grade 11 Early Entrance Scholarship</u> is June 30th. Grade 11 students who apply before the deadline may receive an additional Early Entrance Scholarship worth \$1,000 if all criteria are met.

Saskatchewan Polytechnic: Student enrolled in a certificate or diploma program for the fall can apply for <u>scholarships</u> beginning August 1st. The application deadline is September 15th for these scholarships.

University of Regina: Any students attending the U of R in the fall are invited to join the \underline{U} of R \underline{O} rientation Activities on September 6th.

University of Saskatchewan: The <u>U-Start Handbook</u> provides newly admitted students with invaluable information on how to register for classes, pay tuition, purchase textbooks, access learning centres, etc.

Sun West School Division - Distance Learning Centre New Programming Options for 2016-2017

AP ARRIVES at Sun West DLC! Starting in September 2016, the Sun West DLC will be offering three Advanced Placement (AP) courses available to students across our province and beyond. These include:

- * AP English Lit & Composition (200 hours, equivalent to English A30/B30)
- * AP Physics 1 (200 hours, equivalent to Physics 30 and Physical Science 20)
- * AP Psychology (200 hours, equivalent to Psych 20 and Psych 30)

Advanced placement is an international academic enrichment program. Through the Advanced Placement courses and exams, high school students can earn university credit and stand out in the admissions process. The annual registration deadline is September 9, 2106

DLC Summer School Registration Deadline: June 29

Summer school provides students with a chance to lighten their load for the next school year or to recover a credit that was not obtained in the current school year.

Only a select number of courses are available for summer session; refer to www.sunwestdlc.ca for a complete course listing.

During the six weeks from July 4 to August 15, students will be responsible to complete all course work and write the final exam.

Due to the intensity of the program, learners will only be allowed to register in one Summer School course.

Dual Credit courses are recognized by both high school and post-secondary institutions, earning the student two credits—one at each school. These classes allow high school students the opportunity to experience the rigor and intensity of a college or university course before immersing themselves in post high-school environments. In addition to the newly acquired knowledge, these learning experiences facilitate the development of effective study habits and time management skills that contribute to success in the post-secondary world.

Dual Credits courses offered through the Sun West DLC abide by a unique schedule and have post-secondary tuition fees attached. There are various courses available through agreements with the University of Saskatchewan, University of Regina, and Sask Polytechnic.

The third annual RDIEC Grade 9 Try a Career Days was hosted in Balgonie, May 17-19, 2016. Once again it was a huge success with

almost 3000 students to attending over the three days. Students were treated to a choice of over 30 hands-on activities mirroring work done in the different careers being profiled by the presenters. Presenters profiled a variety of careers from health care professions to masonry. While the students participated in the hands-on activities presenters were able to talk with them about career pathway options, how the core subjects are applied in their industry/occupation, along with labour market opportunities now and in the future This event is designed increase student awareness of career possibilities in the Regina region and provides them with important career pathway information in preparation for their high school course selections. In addition all the students attended a safety presentation by Work Safe Saskatchewan focusing on work place hazards and workers right and responsibilities. The intent of this presentation is to establish a culture of safety in young people before entering the labour force in order move Saskatchewan closer to the target of Mission Zero.
